
Jim Reese Author Reading

Award-winning author—and UNO alum— Jim Reese will be reading from his new essay collection, *Coming to a Neighborhood Near You—the Repercussions of Crime and Punishment*, followed by audience discussion. An associate professor of English at Mount Marty University in Yankton, South Dakota, Reese spent fourteen years in residency for the National Endowment for the Arts' interagency initiative with the Federal Bureau of Prisons, where he established Yankton Federal Prison Camp's first creative writing and publishing workshop. He is the author of eight books of poetry and nonfiction, and speaks throughout the country on the repercussions of crime, the benefits of writing for wellness in a correctional environment and connecting with people in marginal, non-traditional spaces.
